Ezra 3:10-13

¹⁰When the builders laid the foundation of the temple of the Lord, the priests in their vestments were stationed to praise the Lord with trumpets, and the Levites, the sons of Asaph, with cymbals, according to the directions of King David of Israel; ¹¹ and they sang responsively, praising and giving thanks to the Lord,

"For he is good,

On Holy Saturday - a moment within the Christian tradition where we wait with grief, lament, and hesitant hope, people will walk in the effort to dismantle the strongholds of Anti-Semitism and Islamophobia that are on the rise in our communities. With the ultimate goal of a lasting, just peace for Israelis and Palestinians, folks will walk the length of the Gaza Strip (approximately 25 miles) through Greater Spokane on March 30, 2024.
