²⁸ When some Midianite traders passed by, they drew Joseph up, lifting him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty pieces of silver. And they took Joseph to Egypt.

²⁹ When Reuben returned to the pit and saw that Joseph was not in the pit, he tore his clothes. ³⁰ He returned to his brothers and said, "The boy is gone, and I, where can I turn?" ³¹ Then they took Joseph's robe, slaughtered a goat, and dipped the robe in the blood. ³² They had the ornamented robe taken to their father, and they said, "This we have found; see now whether it is your son's robe or not." ³³ He recognized it and said, "It is my son's robe! ¹When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ²And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. ³They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" ⁴When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. ⁵As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. ⁶But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. ⁶But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." ⁵So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

On Holy Saturday - a moment within the Christian tradition where we wait with grief, lament, and hesitant hope, people will walk in the effort to dismantle the strongholds of Anti-Semitism and Islamophobia that are on the rise in our communities. With the ultimate goal of a lasting, just peace for Israelis and Palestinians, folks will walk the length of the Gaza Strip (approximately 25 miles) through Greater Spokane on March 30, 2024.
